

Bylaw 9. Regional Conventions

INTRODUCTION

Under the Constitution of the Photographic Society of New Zealand Inc. (PSNZ) the Executive Officers have been given the power to create and set Bylaws that are applicable to the description of specific events, activities, jobs, portfolios and/or publications that fall within the operations of the Society.

Objectives of this Bylaw

This Bylaw is intended to outline the processes and jurisdiction given to the PSNZ affiliated club (Assisting Club) working with the PSNZ Events subcommittee for the conduct of a PSNZ regional convention so that they may organise and host a successful convention that meets the needs and educational objectives of the Society – “Helping Photographers Grow”.

-
- (a) The Council has divided New Zealand into three regions:
- The Northern region is that part of the North Island north of a line drawn immediately north of New Plymouth to immediately north of Tolaga Bay, excluding the Taupo region.
 - The Central region is the remainder of the North Island, including the Taupo region.
 - The Southern region is all the South Island.
- (b) The Society will hold annual regional conventions in the geographic locations where the national convention is **not** being held, which will last no longer than two (2) days and two (2) nights.
- (c) Each regional convention will be conducted by the PSNZ Events subcommittee and the Assisting Club from the region, appointed for that purpose by the Council.
- (d) The convention must be organised in accordance with the decisions of Council and conveyed through the PSNZ Councillor for Events.
- (e) The PSNZ Events subcommittee must establish and operate a proper accounting system over the duration of their activities in operating the regional convention.
- (f) Full details about the hosting and organisation of a convention are contained in the PSNZ Manual for the Conduct of a Regional Convention and must be referred to for all matters.
